



2023 Women's Interclub Matches

Regular Season Match Rules Sheet

1. **Match Format:** Four-Ball Net Match Play
2. **Tees:** Teams should play from a target yardage of 4,800-5,800 yards but must be mutually agreed upon by both captains in the scheduled match.
3. **Scoring:** A total of two (2) Four-Ball Match Play matches are played in each home and away team match session. Each Four-Ball match is worth 6 points contested in a Nassau scoring format. The front 9 match is worth 2 points, back 9 match worth 2 points, and the 18-hole overall match total worth 2 points. A team is awarded 1 point for a tie. Each team match session has a combined 12 points.
4. **Handicaps for League Play Matches:** The Women's Interclub Matches are competed in a NET scoring format. 90% of most current handicap allowances are permitted.
5. **Advice:** In accordance with the Rule 24.4 in the Rules of Golf, each team may name **one person** (an "advice giver") who may give advice and other help as allowed in Rule 10.2b(2) to players on the team during a round and who may be asked for advice by players on the team. The advice giver may be the team captain, a team coach, or other person (including a team member playing in the competition). The advice giver must be identified to the Committee before giving advice. The Committee may allow a team's advice giver to change during a round or during the competition.
6. **Session Winners:** The team which earns 6.5 or more points is declared the team match session winner and will be credited with a win in their pod record, while the losing side gets a loss. A win is worth 3 points, a tie 1.5 points and a loss 0 points.
7. **Session Ties:** If a session is tied 6-6, it is declared a tie and the overall session points (3) will be halved. There is no playoff required for regular season matches.
8. **Scoring/Official Results:** Match results & points must be reported to a member of the home team staff. A representative from both sides should be present at the scoring area/conclusion of all matches to verify the points are recorded accurately. Once the overall winner is determined, the results are deemed to have been officially announced.
9. **Posting of Individual Gross Scores:** Each player is required to post their score to the handicap system. These scores will not automatically be posted for each player's GHIN account and the player is responsible for posting such scores.
